- Entries, named where possible, will be received 6-8pm Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October 2011 and from 7am Saturday 29th October 2011. Entry to pavilion for exhibitors on show day is via Fallon Street Horse Gate only (adjacent to the Rock Yard).
- Judging from 9.30am to 11.30am Sat 29th October 2011.
- Containers supplied, unless indicated otherwise.
- All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor, except in floral art section.
- Exhibits must not be removed from the pavilion without the consent of the steward.
- EXHIBITS MAY BE COLLECTED ON SUNDAY 30th OCTOBER 2011 FROM 3PM.
- THIS PAVILION WILL OPEN TO THE PUBLIC FROM 11.30am SATURDAY 29TH OCTOBER 2011.

## **PROTESTS & PROCEDURES**

A protest or complaint against any exhibit or exhibitor may be lodged verbally with the Chief Steward of the relevant section no later than ten minutes after the judging of the exhibit or exhibitor. The Chief Steward must be provided with the exact nature of the complaint and act, if necessary, to maintain competitive fairness. The Chief Steward may choose to refer the matter to the Protests Committee, which shall comprise the President of the Society, or a Vice President and two other members of the General Committee. A protest or complaint or an appeal against the decision of a Chief Steward may be lodged in writing with the Secretary no later than 10 pm on the day of judging. Such protest, such complaint or appeal shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which shall be forfeited if the protest, complaint or appeal proves to be frivolous or vexatious. A matter lodged this way shall be dealt with by the Protests Committee within 24 hours of lodgment and the decision of the Protest Committee shall be final. NB: No protest or complaint will be considered if it refers simply to a judge's decision.

\* No exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging.

\* Any exhibitor or associate who behaves offensively on the Showground will be removed from the ground and may be refused admission.
